<u>Additional information for Agenda Item 5 – Health and Wellbeing Strategy and</u> Refresh 2019-2024

The Following should replace the highlighted data on page 47:

2017 data for GCSE outcomes (the most recent data available) shows a gap of 12.9 between the average Attainment 8 score at GCSE for disadvantaged pupils (41.2) achieving Attainment 8 average score at GCSE and all other pupils groups (54.1). This is higher than the London gap (9.80), but lower and in line with the than national gap (12.83).

Additional information to be added into the Report for Agenda Item 6 - Routes into Employment for Vulnerable Cohorts

This data should be added in at paragraph 3.6.5, Page 52:

Work has been done cross referencing several databases to verify the information provided by the referring sources.

We can now confirm that 70, (67%), of the 104 candidates referred are Merton residents. Of those 70 Merton residents:

- 20, (41%), are or were known to YOT
- 19, (27%), are care leavers.
- 16, (23%), have SEN, but do not have EHCps
- 12, (17%), have EHCps
- 4, (6%), are care leavers with EHCps who are or were known to YOT.

The data cleanse identified a flaw in the formula that converted addresses into Merton wards which accounts for the change in the number of Merton residents declared.

Croydon, Wandsworth, Sutton, Lewisham and Brent residents have benefited from the opportunities sources but not at the expense of Merton residents.

Additional information to be added into the Report for Agenda Item 6 - Routes into Employment for Vulnerable Cohorts - Legal implications not in the original report:

- 8.1.1 Any external services procured which are directly in support of the routes to employment proposals should be procured under the procurement regime relevant to the total value of the contract.
- 8.2 Any matter to be incorporated into contracts, whether currently binding the Council or to be entered into should be compliant with the general obligations

- of the Council with regard to carrying out procurement. Obligations such as local labour and sourcing considerations will need to be considered on a case by case basis.
- 8.3 As such care should be taken that procurements and contracts are:
- 8.3.1 compliant with the Equality Act 2010 and do not discriminate against relevant categories;
- 8.3.2 compliant with competition law as well as the general treaty obligations (Transparency, Equal treatment and non-discrimination, Proportionality, Mutual recognition);
- 8.3.3 compliant with the Public Services (Social Value) Act 2012.
