police. The first v	visit to the premises to	ook place in May 200	8 and involve	ed the licensing	department of th	e LBM	
and the then G	ambling Commission	on Compliance Mana	ager. At this	s time the pr	emises appeared	to be	
predominantly air	med towards poker to	the extent that poker	tables were s	et out in the ma	ain bar area. The r	neeting	
was followed up	with an advisory letter	r from the Licensing I	Department (L	LBM)			
There seemed to be a lull in complaints received until 2013 when another visit was made by Police and the							
Licensing Depart	ment (LBM). This wa	as again followed up w	vith an adviso	ry letter from t	he Licensing Dep	artment	
(LBM). It was als	BM). It was also apparent that the primary use of the premises was for poker and limits were being exceeded.						

am aware that the premises were visited by officers from the Gambling Commission on 19 September 2013.

On 12th December 2013 as part of Operation Condor the premises were again visited by police and the Licensing Department (LBM).

On 9th January 2014 a joint meeting was held with Robert Frost. He had apparently taken over full control of the premises in September 2013. The issue of the complaints regarding gambling and the current situation at the

premises were discussed. It was apparent that the previous operators of the premises including the Designated Premises Supervisor had now left the premises. Mr Frost was advised of the need to make an application to vary the DPS.

On 17th January 2014 a Closure Notice under Section 19 Criminal Justice and Police Act 2001 was served as the premises were operating in breach of their licensing condition, in that there was no suitable DPS in place. At the time of service there were in the region of 10 customers on the premises consuming alcohol. On 21st January 2014 the Closure Notice was terminated following the receipt of an application to vary the DPS.

On 28th November 2014 a further joint visit was made to the premises by myself and officers from the Licensing Department (LBM). This followed more complaints made to the Licensing Department. There were in the region of 35-40 persons playing poker in a rear "function room". There appeared to be free access to the room by anyone using the snooker club and appeared to have no restrictions although the poker was being operated by the "Pollards Hill Poker Club". The room was set up with a number of card tables and poker was being played. On this visit access to the premises from the street was via an open and unattended door.

I spoke to the DPS who I know as Pauline O'Hara. An inspection of the premises was carried out and Ms O'Hara asked to produce a number of documents. She was unable to produce her personal licence. The Part A and B of the premises licence was produced, it was identified that Ms O'Hara's address details were incorrect on the premises licence were incorrect, there also appeared to be a discrepancy in who should be the premises licence holder.

I am aware that the premises are licensed for three gaming machines at the premises. On inspection there were 6 machines at the premises, one of which appeared to be a fixed odd betting type machine.

Prior to attending the premises I obtained a plan of the premises, upon inspection of the premises it is apparent that this plan was wholly inaccurate. A Closure Notice under Section 19 Criminal Justice and Police Act 2001was served on Ms O'Hara for the following breaches of licensing conditions:-

1. Incorrect details of the premises licence holder.

2. Incorrect details of DPS (address) on the Part A produced.

3. Incorrect premises layout.

4. Six (6) gaming machines being present.

I am aware that items 1,2 and 4 have been rectified/clarified and item 3 is subject to licence variation application and therefore cannot be terminated.

On 20th February 2015 a licensing visit was carried out. The premises were open and alcohol was being served. There were no Temporary Event Notices in force in relation to this date.

Conclusion

A number of conditions have been suggested in my representations to assist in the regulation of the premises should the variation application be granted
