(a) I will supply alcohol only to residential addresses which accord with card details given. Delivery will be made by me and ID's carefully checked. I intend to encourage responsible drinking at home.

(b) All deliveries will be made to home addresses preventing drink-driving and persons congregating in the street as they do outside ordinary off-licenses. I will check both over the phone and on delivery that persons are not drunk. ID's will be checked both to prevent under-age drinking and misuse of credit/debit cards.

(c) Irresponsible drinking will be discouraged by:-

(i) Not selling Beer/Lager of greater strength than 6% sold in multi packs only

(ii) Minimum order of £25-00p.

My business will promote public safety by encouraging people to drink responsibly at home preventing drink-driving and persons out on the street drunk.

(d) Requiring home address and other restrictions will avoid sale to street drinkers.

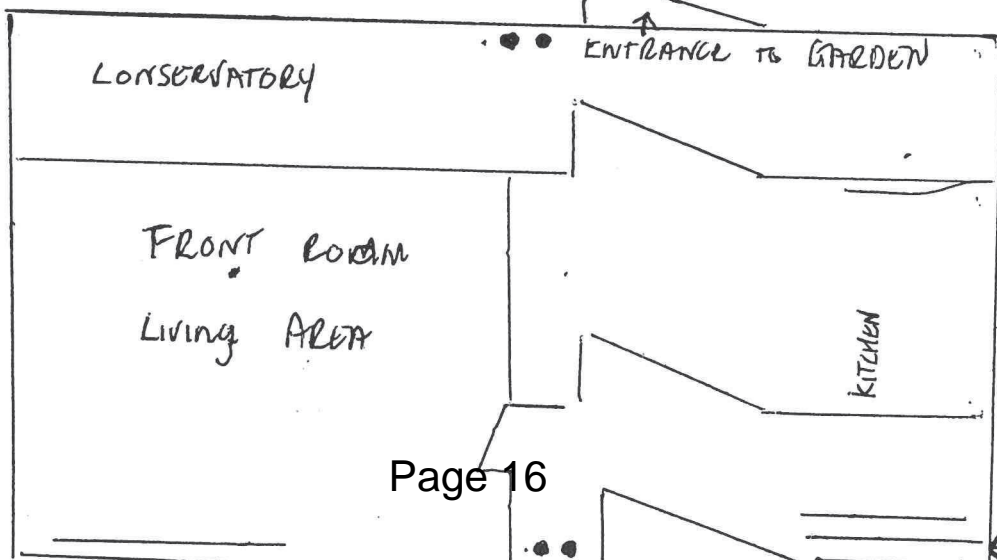

On 13th August 2014 an application was received from Mr Leon Thompson for a premises licence under the Licensing Act 2003. The application can be summarised as follows:-

Supply of Alcohol Monday to Sunday 0000-0500
Hours open to the Public Monday to Saturday 0000-0500 (Sunday has been
crossed out on the Police copy)

Police wish to make representations on the grounds of the **Prevention of Crime and Disorder.**

The licensable area provided with this application is not clear, however it would appear that it is proposed that the entire premises will be licensed. This house is situated in a residential street on Lavender Fields ward, a short distance from Figge's Marsh. The licensing of a residential house is unprecedented in Merton.

The applicant has been spoken to and he stated that the storage of the alcohol would be mainly in a "lock up" in his garden and his conservatory.

A search of police crime reports has been conducted for a period between 27/2/14 and 27/8/14 on Eveline Road revealed twelve(12) allegations, broken down as follows, Two(2) criminal damage, Two(2) assaults, Three(3) burglaries including One(1) garage burglary, Two(2) theft from motor vehicle, One(1) theft, One(1) motor vehicle interference and One(1) public order offence.

These premises will add to these statistics by the very nature of what is stored and sold.

The applicant proposes to sell alcohol by home delivery between 0000 and 0500. The application states that the "business will promote public safety by encouraging people to drink responsibly at home preventing drink driving and persons on the

street drunk". It is difficult to imagine who is likely to avail themselves of this service between these hours unless they have already been drinking.

A search of police indices for the month of July 2014 revealed in the region Sixty(60) allegations of a domestic nature where one or all parties were under the influence of alcohol. The ability therefore to have more alcohol delivered to the door may well add to this figure and clearly impinges on the **Public Safety** licensing objective

Conclusion

The applicant has made an attempt to show how he will reduce the risk of his business operation, however, it is impossible to put in place enough conditions on this licence application to ensure the licensing objectives are upheld. With this in mind it is asked that this application is rejected.

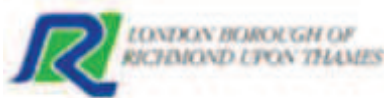
It is my understanding that that applicant wishes to provide alcohol from a garden shed in a quiet residential road between the hours of 12.00am and 5.00 am.

1. This activity would constitute a material change of use and would require planning permission that would not be granted for this type of activity in this location.
2. Deliveries to and from the premises, at this time of night will without any doubt cause a disturbance to neighbouring properties.
3. Despite what has been stated in the application the supply of alcohol will be targeted to and attract orders from people who will have been already either at pubs or clubs and will therefore fall foul of the Councils Public Health objectives which are to encourage sensible drinking and to curb binge drinking.
4. The holding of large quantities of alcohol in a garden outbuilding will make this an attractive target for crime.
5. There will be a temptation for the activity to migrate to sales from the premises which would attract antisocial behaviour into a quiet residential area.
6. There will be significant Health and Safety issues to the employees working late at night who are carrying both alcohol and cash and delivering to unknown premises.
