- 1. Special Policy Area (premises licences and club certificates)
- 1.1 The premises are in the special policy area. Accordingly the relevant section of Merton's Licensing Policy is particularly relevant to this application though the sub-committee is to have regard to the policy as a whole.
- 2. Type of hearing and powers of the sub-committee
- 2.1 The sub-committee is required to determine the application by taking such of the steps set out below as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

 - (iv) To suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months
 - (v) To revoke the licence.

Premises Supervisor and Premises Licence Holder Mr Nithiyakumar THANGAVELAUTHAM. The DPS stated that he was the only member of staff				
present and that he had made the sale, thinking that the customer had looked over				
18 years old.				
A Fixed Penalty Notice was issued for the offence of Selling Alcohol to an individual				
under 18 contrary to Sec 146 Licencing Act 2003. Mr Thangavelautham presented his full copy of the Premises Licence for inspection

ANNEX 1 TABLE OF MANDATORY CONDITIONS UNDER THE LICENSING ACT 2003

- 1. That no supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence
- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- **2**. That every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- **3**. Where one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each such individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority by a licence granted under the Private Security Industry Act 2001 or entitled to carry out that activity by virtue of section 4 of the Private Security Industry Act 2001.
- **4.** (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- **5.** A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 6. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—
- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula—

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

where-

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,

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licence:



- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

Where the permitted price given by paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

I have received a copy of an application for a premises licence review under the Licensing Act 2003 dated 5th September 2016 from Russ Stevens The Police Licensing Officer.

London Borough of Merton's Trading Standards Section (local weights and measures authority) is a responsible authority under the Act.

Alcohol misuse by young people is a strong contributory factor in a wide range of anti-social behaviour and criminal offences affecting our community. Such behaviour can include public order offences (often anti-social in nature, these can involve disorderly groups of young people who can be rowdy, threatening and abusive to residents), criminal damage and minor and serious assaults. The Trading Standards Service is committed to preventing the sale of age restricted products to young people and fully supports this review application on the basis of the following licensing objectives-

- a. The prevention of crime and disorder
- b. The prevention of public nuisance, and
- c. The protection children from harm.

The Licensing Sub-Committee may wish to consider whether or not it is appropriate for all staff serving alcohol in the shop to attend an accredited 'Do You Pass' training course that provides practical advice and guidance on how to prevent the sale of age restricted products to young people. The Trading Standards Service provides such a course free of charge to local businesses. Additionally it may also be considered agentation for the DPS or a personal licence holder to be on duty at the serving counter of the shop at all times that

alcohol is available for sale.

I hope that this representation will assist the Sub-Committee when considering this matter.
