Licensing Hearing: Co-op, 85 Ridgway, SW19 4ST. Hearing on Sept 1st at 10.30 am.

Please find attached a further document for the sub-committee to consider. This document is a continuation of the petition already submitted by Mrs Kugananthajothy, and includes 37 more signatures from local residents against the above application by the Co-op. With the 93 signatures on the petition presented by Mrs Kugananthajothy, this brings the total number of voices trying to be heard against the application to <u>130</u>.

Merton Council's Licensing Policy says that an "..... intention of the policy is to ensure that local residents are not unreasonably disturbed, whether in the street or at home, by activities within licensed premises or by customers arriving at, or leaving, licensed premises", and that an effective policy can control "..... the negative impacts which affect residents, such as an increase in noise, nuisance, anti-social behaviour and crime and disorder." Given the location of 85 Ridgway in a quiet residential area, the lack of parking, and the extended hours of licence that the Co-op has applied for, I am puzzled as to how the Co-op feels their application fits with Council policy.

This is a petition against the application by the Co-op for a licence to sell alcohol at 85 Ridgway between 07.00 and 23.00 Monday to Saturday and to 22.30 on Sunday. NB the Co-op does not yet have a shop at this location and is testing the ground. Local residents object to the application in the strongest terms, on the grounds that the granting of such an application will:

- create a public nuisance through noise and disturbance to residents, as a result of deliveries at all
 hours and bringing high numbers of cars and people to a residential area completely unsuited to
 it. There is already a small local shop a few paces away that serves local demand while being on a
 sufficiently small scale that it doesn't cause problems. A larger Co-op store will cause noise and
 disturbance at very unsociable hours given the extended hours of opening proposed.
- increase crime and disorder in the midst of a residential area by attracting non-residents in search
 of alcohol at all times of day and night. There is also no need for another shop selling alcohol—
 apart from the local corner store, Jenkins, Tesco Express on Wimbledon Hill opens 08.00 to 21.00
 on weekdays and 08.00 to 17.00 on Sundays so is within easy reach of local residents but in a
 more suitable location and with more acceptable opening hours.
- negatively affect the many local children, due to the increase in traffic, inevitable increase in noise and footfall in the local area and the potentially rowdy behaviour caused by selling alcohol so late at night.

Local residents were not notified of the application by the Co-op and so did not have the opportunity to object within the official timescale. A notice about the licensing application was attached to the window of 85 Ridgway but at some distance from the pavement and was not readable without trespassing on private property.

We the undersigned OBJECT in the strongest terms to the Co-op's application and urge the licensing sub-committee to REJECT the application.
