- 1.1 To present the final report and recommendations resulting from the scrutiny review of housing supply (with a focus on affordable housing) for Cabinet consideration.

- 2.1 At the first meeting of the municipal year 2014/15, the Panel agreed to undertake a task group review looking at the provision of affordable housing.

- 3.1 In carrying out its review, the task group engaged a range of stakeholders, council officers and cabinet members to ensure that evidence based recommendations could be made that would support the achievement of the aims of this review, as outlined below:

- To understand housing market characteristics and the level of housing need in Merton.

This would include:

- National and local policy context surrounding the provision of affordable housing;
- Data on housing need in Merton;
- The role of the local authority and partners (i.e. Registered Providers, private landlords and private developers) in ensuring good quality housing;

- An overview of what affordable housing is being built in Merton
 - To review the councils existing housing strategy with a view to strengthening/developing this policy in light of the reviews findings;
 - To determine how the council might support and encourage the production of new affordable homes in Merton and what land is available for development;
 - To determine what good practice exists elsewhere that might be utilised in responding to the demand for affordable housing
