

Population – borough wide




- Overall 6% increase in population

- Decrease in proportion of over-65's

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

Age Structure: Aged 0-4




Pockets of older people in Cricket Green and Village wards



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After UK, most residents born in South Asia and EU Accession countries




Main EU Accession country populations in the East

Religious Belief in Merton - 2001 v 2011








Merton Park ward has a clear West-East divide between Christians and Muslims Religious belief: Muslim




Largest overall Muslim concentration around St Helier





4.5% drop in Married or same-sex civil partnership: no children households








Housing – borough wide

6% - decrease in terraced houses/bungalows since 2001







Main concentrations in Western parts of the borough






Tenure – borough wide

Social rented from local authority considerably lower than London average



Lower Morden and Longthornton wards with most mortgages/loans


Border of Merton Park and Ravensbury particularly high concentration of private rented










Car ownership – ward overview




Where there are fewer transport hubs, more cars







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

In summary

- More people (6%)

- Good self-reported health
- East / west divide continues
- ONS mid-year estimates not to be trusted
