<u>Council 13 September 2023</u> <u>Liberal Democrat Amendment 2 to the Strategic Theme Report</u> <u>Amendment 2: Tackling poverty borough-wide</u>

To add the following recommendation to the Strategic Theme Report:

B. Council appreciates efforts to mitigate the impact of deprivation and the cost of living crisis (including maintaining the existing Council Tax Support Scheme and a reduction in the increase in Council Tax from 5% to 4% for a number of residents). Council requests that Cabinet consider as part of the Business Planning process for 2024/25 the costs and benefits of enhancing, for one year only in the first instance, the Council Tax Support Scheme by, for example, varying the taper rate (the rate at which the benefit is reduced as income increases) and the eligibility criteria (to include those residents who are struggling through the cost-of-living emergency, but fall just outside eligibility criteria and therefore do not currently qualify for council tax support). Council notes that the Council Tax Support Scheme has the potential to reach all deprived households in the Borough whereas other measures based on Council Tax bands, ward or postcodes can miss pockets of deprivation.
