Alexandra, 33 Wimbledon Hill Road, Wimbledon, London
Premises Licence Variation Application – Hearing 6 February 2015

I am instructed by Young's and have submitted on their behalf the variation application for the Alexandra.

Young's have read the representations which have been received and have asked me to write to you to clarify what precisely is proposed in the application.

I would be grateful if you could pass this letter and the attachments to the members of the Licensing Committee and to those who have made a representation.

The proposal is limited to the first floor of the Alexandra only and involves two principal changes to the licensing drawing which are as follows:

1. To refurbish to a high standard the existing first floor external area, to change the position of the existing bar, to erect a canopy over part of the area and to install fixed seating in "beach style huts".
2. To create in the current manager's accommodation a new trading area with a bar whose principal use will be for dining with tables and chairs, a new kitchen and toilet. This new area is a relatively small increase and will have seats for 40 customers.

The intention is to create a first floor of some style and sophistication which can be enjoyed by all customers including families and which will especially encourage diners to use the first floor.

Customers will be able to access the first floor via the existing staircase and, indeed, remain there without the need to use the ground floor or its facilities at all.

There are no proposed changes at all to the existing licensable activities, hours of operation or to the ground floor or the outside area; the variation is, essentially simply a refurbishment and an extension on the first floor of the premises.

Finally, I attach to this letter a more detailed drawing which shows the proposed layout of seating on the first floor and some mood boards to give the committee a flavour of the style of the decoration proposed.

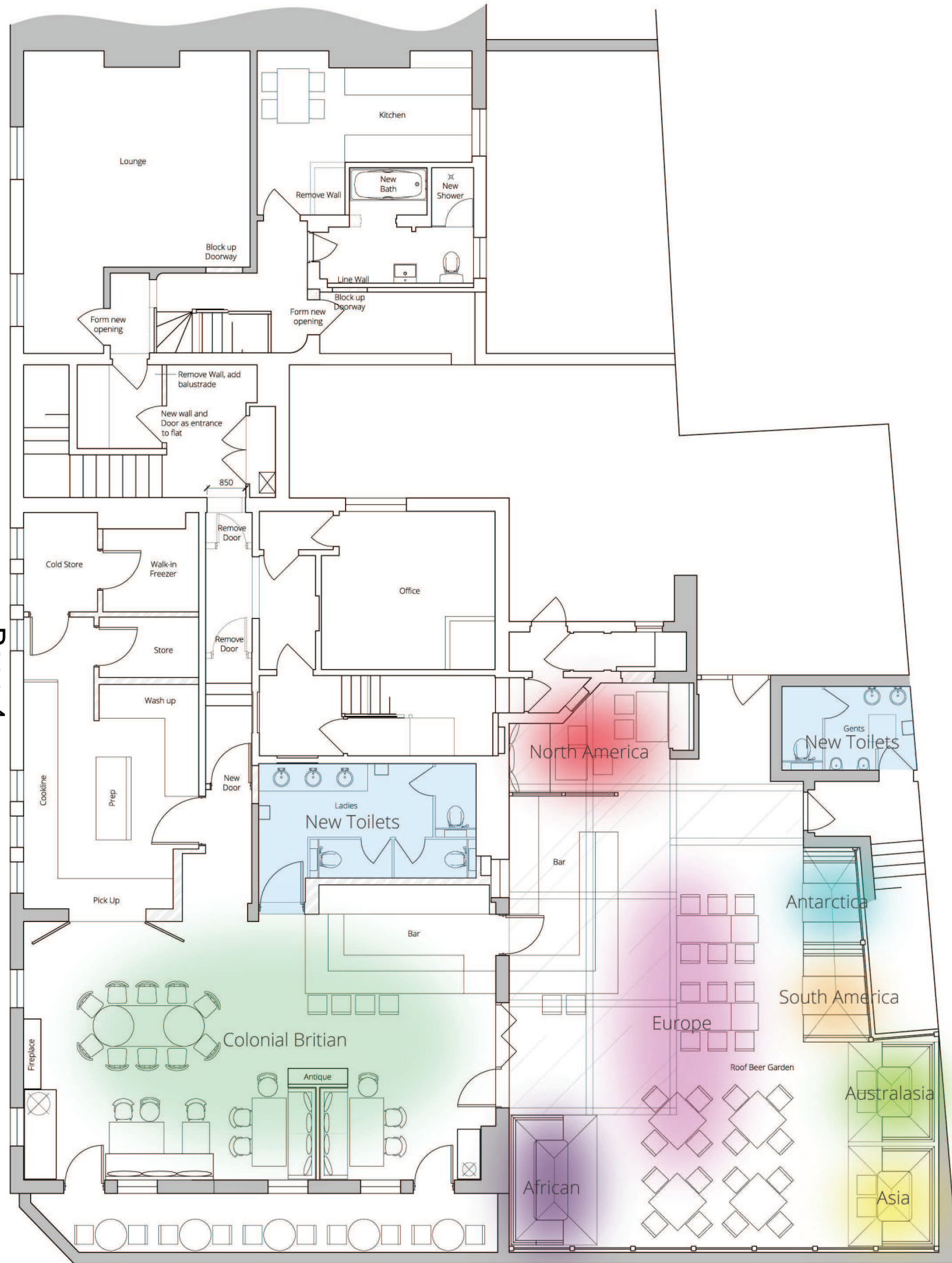
We are, of course, happy to provide more information to the committee at the hearing.

Inspired by a Thailand street stall, with colander lighting and plastic benches and colourful artwork.



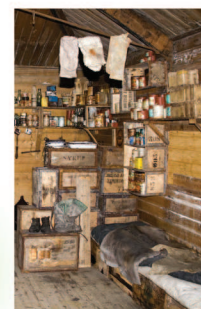
North American Caboose

African Hut

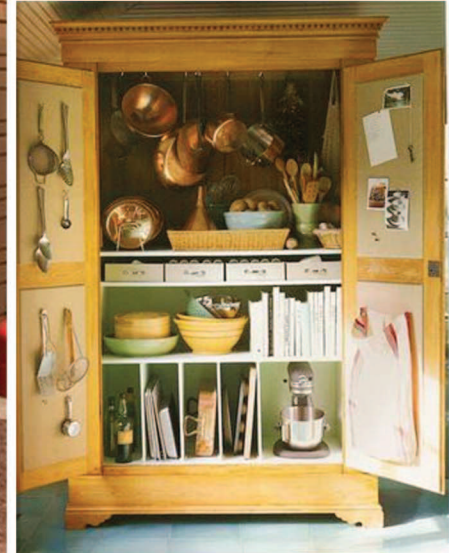
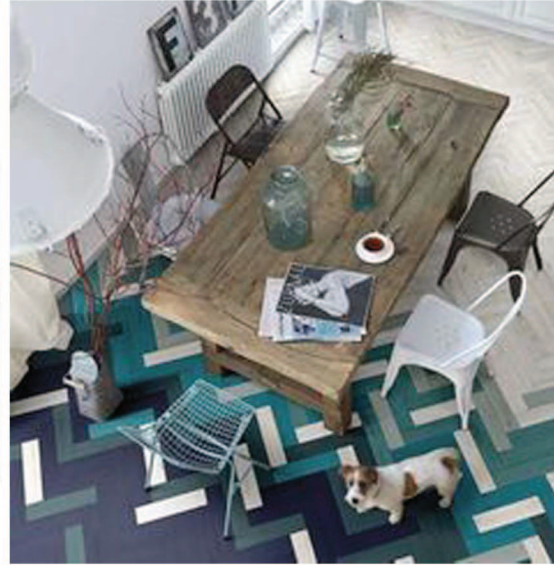
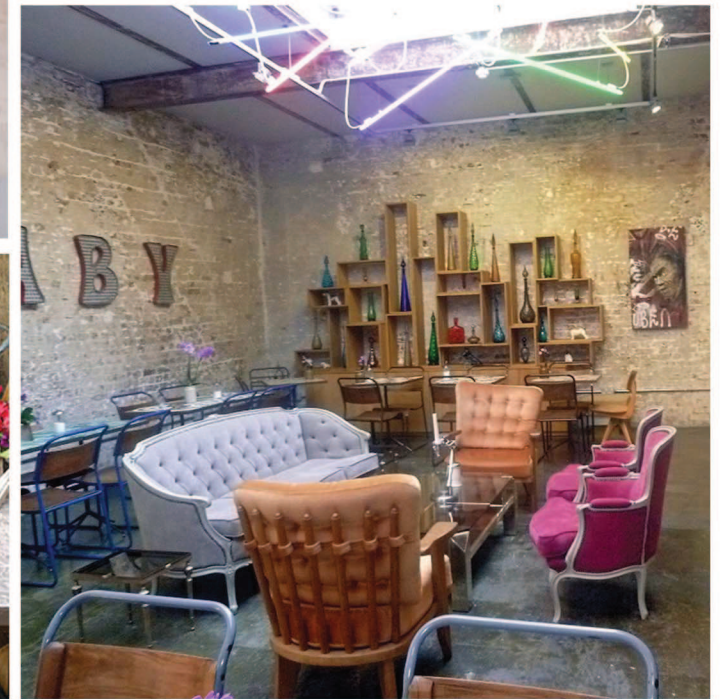
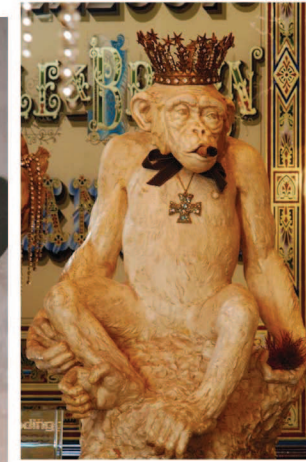
Moroccan street market interior, hanging leather shoes to the walls and ethnic furniture.
