SPERA have our AGM this evening and it is my intention to discuss this matter with members before I make a final decision on attending the licensing committee meeting. At present I am very happy that existing restrictions aimed at reducing noise for local residents remains in place and I note the comments about the rubbish coming from another establishment. My main concern remains the numbers attending these premises given the changes in nature of the facilities to be offered. It would seem that with 5 table table tennis tables and less seating there may be a capaicity issue that needs looking at by the committee. I am sure there are regulations that deturmine the numbers based upon seating capacity and the area available for public use. I am not an expert on these rules but the licensing officer should be able to give some guidance. My view is the numbers probably

should be reduced. I accept that because these premises are not seeking any variance to their existing hours this is not the appropriate forum for discussing reduced hours in the early morning but you should be aware that we may seek a license review if these premises become problematical after any license changes are agreed. We agree that these facilities require a strong management team.

I will confirm the SPERA position tomorrow.
