1. Special Policy Area (premises licences and club certificates)

1.1 The premises are not in the special policy area.

4.1 A legal officer appointed by the Assistant Director of Corporate Governance and Head of Legal Services will attend the hearing to advise the subcommittee on statutory provision and legal matters.

5. Licensing Officer comments

- 5.1 This application is to vary an existing premises licence.
- 5.2 The application seeks to amend the plan. The plan submitted would appear to be the same as the one attached to the licence at the moment, except for a florescent green line outlining the front outside area. The applicant states that no licensable activities are proposed in the external area.
- 5.3 They also wish to alter the opening times to allow for earlier opening, remove non-standard hours and change two conditions.

- 5.4 Changing condition 3 would allow for the use of the outside area between 10:00 and 23:00 Monday to Saturday, 22:30 on Sunday. No use can be made of the outside areas at the moment save the rear yard for smoking only. The variation would also seek to delete this condition condition 9.
- 5.5 A more comprehensive condition regarding CCTV is also requested.





Combined fighting sports – defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts – are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
  - a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
  - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
  - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
  - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.

any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.

- any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;

- any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
- any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

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#### Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

Mandatory conditions where licence authorises supply of alcohol

Where this premises licence authorises the supply of alcohol, the following conditions shall apply:

- no supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
  - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
  - (c) every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

#### Mandatory condition: exhibition of films

Where this premises licence authorises the exhibition of films, the admission of children to the exhibition of any film shall be restricted as follows:

(1) Where the film classification body is specified in the licence, unless subsection (3)(b) applies, admission of children shall be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that body.

(2) Where:

- (a) the film classification body is not specified in the licence, or
- (b) the relevant licensing authority has notified the holder of the licence that this subsection applies to the film in question, the admission of children shall be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that licensing authority.
- (3) In this section:
  - (a) "children" means persons aged under 18; and
  - (b) "film classification body" means the person or persons designated as the authority under section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 (c.39) (authority to determine suitability of video works for classification).

#### Mandatory condition: door supervision

- (1) Where this premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, all door supervisors shall be licensed by the Security Industry Authority (SIA).
- (2) But nothing in subsection (1) requires such a condition to be imposed:
  - in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c.12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films), or
  - in respect of premises in relation to:
  - any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
  - any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act).
- (3) For the purposes of this section:

(a) "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and
 (b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

#### Prohibited conditions: Plays

If this premises licence authorises the performance of plays, no condition shall be attached to the licence as to the nature of the plays that may be performed, or the manner of performing plays, under the licence.

But the above paragraph does not prevent the London Borough of Merton from imposing any condition which it considers necessary on the grounds of public safety.

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#### Mandatory Licensing Conditions 2010

- 1. (i) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
  - (ii) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children:-
    - games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-
      - drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
      - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
    - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
    - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
    - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on:-
      - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or(ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
    - (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- 2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 4. (i) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(ii) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

- 5. The responsible person shall ensure that -
  - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -

(i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
(ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
(iii) still wine in a glass: 125ml; and

(b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

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Annex 1 - Conditions attached after a Review Hearing by the Licensing Authority

- (1) No person under 21 shall be allowed on the premises.
- (2) Off Sales shall not be permitted.
- (3) No use shall be made of any external area of the premises.

(4) No bottles or glasses shall be taken out of the internal area of the premises.

(5) CCTV shall be installed, maintained and made available to Police & Council Officers.

(6) Designated Premises Supervisor shall check the immediate vicinity of the premises regularly and take appropriate action to prevent noise emanating from the premises.

(7) Designated Premises Supervisor shall check the immediate vicinity of the premises regularly and remove any pub-related mess.

(8) A notice (a minimum of A4 size) shall be placed immediately adjacent to the exits from the premises stating:- "This is a residential area, PLEASE LEAVE QUIETLY".

Annex 2 - Conditions attached after a Licensing Hearing (08.08.07) granting a Variation to the Premises Licence conditions

(9) Without prejudice to the generality of (3) above use of the rear yard as described by the applicant is permitted for the purposes of smoking between 10.00
- 23.00 hours (Monday to Saturday) and 10.00 - 22.30 hours (Sunday).

(10) The Designated Premises Supervisor shall ensure that the patrols of the rear yard shall take place at regular intervals (frequency of patrols to be at least every 30 minutes) throughout licensing hours.

Annex 3 - No Additional Conditions were attached after a Licensing Hearing (19.12.07) to Review the Premises Licence.
