Notes for Guidance

5 Montague Close

This application cannot be used to vary the licence so as to extend the period for which the licence has effect or to vary substantially the premises to which it relates. If you wish to make that type of change to the premises licence, you should make a new premises licence application under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.

- 1. You do not have to pay a fee if the only purpose of the variation for which you are applying is to avoid becoming liable for the late night levy
- 2. Describe the premises. For example, the type of premises, its general situation and layout and any other information which could be relevant to the licensing objectives. Where your application includes off-supplies of alcohol and you intend to provide a place of consumption of these off-supplies of alcohol, you must include a description of where the place will be and its proximity to the premises.

 - Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
 - Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
 - Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.

- a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
- o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
- 4. Where taking place in a building or other structure please tick as appropriate (indoors may include a tent).





Mandatory conditions where licence authorises supply of alcohol

Prohibited conditions: Plays

If this premises licence authorises the performance of plays, no condition shall be attached to the licence as to the nature of the plays that may be performed, or the manner of performing plays, under the licence.

But the above paragraph does not prevent the London Borough of Merton from imposing any condition which it considers necessary on the grounds of public safety.



Thank you for notice of the above application for a licence for operation from 8 am until 11 pm for Safestore tenant Hopfresh to sell alcohol

from storage facilities, Gap Road, SW19, apparently 'to fulfil telephone and on-line orders'.

Our Association objects to this proposal for the following reasons:

This is a storage facility. While some businesses use Safestore as a holding place for their stock, to our knowledge, there are no alcohol sales or premises (on or off premise) at this site whatsoever. Surely there is a reason for that fact.

Wimbledon is well saturated with alcohol premises, alcohol sales on/off premises, and both Council and Police struggle to contain the damage caused by alcohol fulled evening visitors to the area, especially the town, that looks like a war zone most weekends at dawn. Any further licence granted anywhere nearby will make the 'cumulative impact' of alcohol consumption in Wimbledon even worse.

The Institute of Alcohol Studies has research indicating that, among other concerns, there is a significant danger with underage drinkers buying from on-line/telephone sales, encouraging addiction while underaged. Wimbledon is above all a family community; there are thousands of young, vulnerable secondary school children who may be tempted to buy illegally online/via phone from such a local business. See the article herewith:

Implications of permitting local online alcohol sales

The applicant has not provided any information on their business, such as, what if a prospective purchaser turned up at their storage unit. Would they be allowed to buy, or refuse a sale? It seems it would be unlikely to be refused, as the 'opening hours' are from dawn until well after dark, and money is money.

What type of enforcement does the Council have, to ensure this 'off the beaten track' site abides by the conditions of their licence? What conditions has the applicant proposed, to ensure none of these concerns would come to fruition? What about when the applicant wants to extend their hours to 'round the clock? What about when they wish to sell retail to customers who turn up at their premises?

Their 'discounted prices' are what lures many people to buy online. Safestore is a STORAGE FACILITY, it is not a retail shopping precinct, and certainly not zoned for commercial business.

Wimbledon town has several vacant premises desperate for commercial tenants. We do not wish Merton Officers to further entice anyone to buy cheap alcohol from a premises that doesn't pay fair commercial rent or rates. That is unfair to the Council and to other Wimbledon businesses who do, eg: Aromatica, The Sampler, Majestic, Wimbledon Wine, Friarwood Wine, Waitrose, Sainsbury's, Morrisons, Tesco etc.

Further, traffic congestion at this address is extremely challenging for many hours of each day, seven days a week. Recent planning proposals to turn the Safestore into a larger facility and/or to add hundreds of homes behind the business was soundly refused because of 'vehicular access issues', as this area is designated for light industry, and light and off-hours vehicular traffic.

This is a storage depot for light industry that serves the local area, but does not conflict with the transport needs of the adjoining homes and thriving local residential communities. (Air pollution was

another major factor, related to increased vehicular movements, that may or may not be an issue, should this business grow.)

Should a 'retail like' premises be permitted in a storage facility, that would encourage other vendors to seek similar set ups, ie very low rent/possibly even avoiding rates altogether, and drawing in vehicular traffic throughout the day and into the night. These customers would exacerbate the already heavy traffic problems on Gap Road, and this proposal would not be acceptable on those grounds, in planning terms.

As an aside: The advert appeared in a space and with a font size so small that it is unlikely others will realise this application has been filed. In our view the advert should be re-run with a legible font size, and the notice period extended. (Please accept this as a formal complaint - we've never seen such minuscule type for a Notice of Application since the inception of the Licensing Act.)

Finally, in our view, the Planning Dept and Planning Enforcement should be consulted, as this would set a precedent whereby 'retail-like' sales become the norm in this industrial setting, further impoverishing the designated commercial shopping parades throughout the borough.

Otherwise, what next: 24/7 operation? A bar/club at Safestore? A renegade 'shopping parade' within the industrial setting? These are our views, based on concerns of residents and homeowners in the immediate area.

Thank you for considering the many consequences of your decision. We urge you to Refuse Permission based on Licensing Conditions regarding Nuisance and Protection of children from harm.





Dear Sir/Madam,

On 30th May 2017 an application was received from Mr Kadir of VPSP Ltd for a Premises Licence under Section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.

The application was summarised as follows:-

A Fast Food Restaurant requesting authority to provide Late Night Refreshment on Friday and Saturday evenings from 11pm to 2am. Specifically "Selling Hot Sandwich".

I made representations on behalf of the Chief Officer of Police. The application was rejected at a Licensing Hearing on 17th July 2017.

On 25th May 2018, an application was received from Mr Kadir for a Premises Licence under Section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003. The application makes exactly the same requests as before, for Late Night Refreshment on Friday and Saturday evenings until 2am. The only variation to the previous application is the additional comment that "We will recruit SIA securities for our premises"

Police wish to make representations to this application on two of the four of the licensing objectives namely:

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder The prevention of Public Nuisance

The SUBWAY brand is a global chain of Submarine Sandwich Restaurants offering Fast Food in the form of hot sandwich rolls, to eat on and off the premises. Every store is an independently owned Franchise. The individual owners are solely responsible for the operation of their businesses, and obtaining all necessary authorities, licences and insurance.

To serve hot food (above ambient temperature) after 11pm and until 5am, a premises must hold a Premises Licence for the provision prize Nigot Refreshment.

Fast Food takeaways operating after 11pm can have an obvious impact on crime and antisocial behaviour levels in the vicinity. Hot food Takeaways offering LNR are often situated very close to alcohol premises to supply demand from people who are often heavily intoxicated, as they leave pubs and clubs at the end of an evening out.

Wimbledon Subway at 6, Hartfield Road is no exception, situated between The Prince of Wales PH and Garratt & Gauge PH.

Wimbledon Town Centre has a vibrant and lively Night Time Economy, with so many premises selling alcohol that it has now become a Cumulative Impact Zone. This CIZ includes Late Night Refreshment outlets.

There are two main concentrations of pubs and clubs in Wimbledon Town Centre. One is close to Wimbledon BR Station and includes 601 Queens Road, Prince of Wales, Suburban, and Garratt & Gauge. Subway is inside this concentration. The other concentration is a 5 minute walk along the Broadway to O'Neills, The Old Frizzle, Wibbas, Smash and The Pod Bar.

At around Midnight on Fridays and Saturdays the NTE footfall is high as Garratt & Gauge and Prince of Wales close for the evening. Most patrons leaving these two bars in Hartfield Road walk past Subway en route to the later opening bars, or to the train station that is diagonally opposite.

Wimbledon Subway's closest rival and direct competition is Burger King at 2 The Broadway. Burger King is also next door to The Prince of Wales PH but on the other side.

Burger King has a Premises Licence to provide Late Night Refreshment to 2am, and out of necessity, they employ uniformed security guards from 9pm.

The risk around Burger King requires constant management.

Experience shows that the risk of alcohol related Crime and Disorder, and Anti-Social Behaviour is greatly reduced when people go straight home after an evening drinking. Most incidents of alcohol related violence in Wimbledon Town Centre occur towards the end of the evening when people are intoxicated. Many of these incidents involve people having just left alcohol premises. At around midnight on a Friday and Saturday night, the town centre can become an arena for drunken violent clashes.

Fast Food Outlets provide a facility to those who wish to linger. Disputes arise between hungry intoxicated customers, and fights occur. Many drunk people are drawn to Fast Food outlets rather than going home.

Fast Food Outlets slow down the dispersal rate dramatically and cause extra strain on Policing.

If a licence to provide Late Night Refreshment is granted for Subway, the risk of alcohol related violence will substantially increase. There is also the obvious risk of increased litter.

I mentioned in my previous representations that Mr Kadir's original application failed to address any of the four Licensing Objectives. The only comments on Part M of the new application mention "SIA securites will be available" and that "there are no musical instruments, no sound pollution, no extra lighting. At night time, there is no children in the store"

This application does not adequately address the Licensing Objectives.

The premises are inside a Cumulative Impact Zone that includes LNR outlets as well as alcohol premises.

There have been no incidents directly connected to Subway since January 2017. Unfortunately the picture different when researching crime figures for the immediate vicinity, including Burger King, two doors along from the premsies, and Prince of Wales PH next door.

The Metropolitan Police strongly advise that this application is rejected.

If the Premises Licence is approved, I strongly recommend that the following conditions are imposed:

- 1. There will be a minimum of 2 uniformed security guards on the premises or immediately outside when the premises is open beyond 2300hrs.
- 2. A good quality digital CCTV will be in operation at all times that the premises is open to the public. Recorded footage will be kept for a minimum of 31 days and will be supplied to Police when requested with the absolute minimum of delay.

On behalf of the Licensing Authority, as a Responsible Authority under the Licensing Act 2003, I write to object to the application to new premises licence application for Subway at 6 Hartfield Road Wimbledon London SW19 3TA. The new premises licence application seeks the following licensable activities:

Late Night Refreshmant (indoors only)
Thursday and Saturday from 23:00 to 02:00 hours.

Premises Opening Times Sunday to Thursday 07:00 to 22:00 hours. Friday and Saturday 07:00 to 02:00 hours.

These premises are situated within the Wimbledon Town Centre cumulative impact zone (CIZ). The current Licensing Policy for the London Borough of Merton dated 6 January 2016 at points 7.1 to 7.6 sets out the Council's reasons for imposing three CIZ's within the Borough. In particular there is a separate paragraph for Wimbledon Town Centre, which states the following:

Wimbledon Town Centre

There has been a significant increase in the number and scale of licensed premises in Wimbledon Town Centre over recent years. This has resulted in a significant number of alcohol related crimes and of complaints being

made to the Council concerning nuisance. The Police have provided evidence regarding alcohol related crime and disorder and the connection between the offences and licensed premises. Anti-social behaviour has led to the Metropolitan Police designating part of the town centre as a dispersal area under the Anti-Social Behaviour Act 2003. Residents and Residents Associations in Wimbledon Town Centre have made representations that the Town Centre is at saturation point. The Police support the designation of Wimbledon Town Centre as a cumulative impact zone.

The Licensing Authority has concerns with this application, in particular the applicant failure to address the special policy.
