Recommendations:

That the Cabinet Member considers the issues detailed in this report and

- A) Notes the result of the statutory consultation that was carried out between 31st of May and 22nd June 2018 on certain aspects of the proposed road safety improvements at Church Hill / St Aubyn's Ave / Lake Road junctions. The proposed measures include a junction entry treatment and double yellow lines. Copy of the consultation document is attached in Appendix 2. Details of the proposed measures are set out in section 3 of this report and shown on plan No. Z35-257-01 attached in Appendix 1.
- B) Considers the representation received in response to the statutory consultation attached in Appendix 3.
- C) Agrees to proceed with the making of the relevant Traffic Management Orders (TMOs) and the implementation of a proposed measures as shown in plan No. Z35-257-01 attached in Appendix 1 and as set out in section 3 of this report.
- D) Agrees to exercise his discretion not to hold a public inquiry on the consultation process.

1. PURPOSE OF REPORT AND EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- 1.1 This report presents the results of the statutory consultation carried on the Councils' proposals to introduce school related improvements along Church Hill and Lake Road, Wimbledon which include junction entry treatment and double yellow lines.
- 1.2 It seeks approval to proceed with the making of the relevant Traffic Management Orders (TMOs) and the implementation of the proposed measures as shown in Drawing No. Z35-257-01 attached in Appendix 1.

2. BACKGROUND

2.1 The Council has an annual rolling programme intended to improve road safety, access and environment at all schools in the borough. The programme also includes addressing issues raised by schools within their school travel plans; promote walking and cycling. The Council also undertakes road safety training that complements hard measures. Although proposed measures are always site specific, one consistent component involves the introduction of a localised 20mph speed limit.

- 2.2 Church Hill and Lake Road are two-way single carriageways subject to a 20mph speed limit. It is a residential road with two relatively large schools Bishop Gilpin primary and Ricards Lodge High school. Over the years there have been a number of safety / speed concerns raised by the schools, residents and other road users.
- 2.3 Bishop Gilpin primary has had a school crossing patrol officer operating in the area for approximately 2 years. Given the junction layout and the volume of pupils in the area, there have been concerns regarding the safety of pupils and the school crossing patrol officer. It is therefore considered that the proposed improvements will safe guard these vulnerable road users.

3. PROPOSED MEASURES

- 3.1 To improve road safety, access and sightlines and manage the potential conflict between pedestrians and vehicles at Church Hill / St Aubyn's Ave / Lake Road junctions it is proposed to introduce a junction entry treatment and some double yellow lines as shown in Drawing No. Z35-257-01 attached in Appendix 1.
- 3.2 In addition to the above, there will be new 'SLOW' markings, some street declutter and road markings in the area will be refreshed.
- 3.3 Following a consultation with the school and Ward Councillors, a statutory consultation was carried out.
- 3.4 It is considered that the proposals will improve access, sightlines and manage the potential conflict between pedestrians and vehicles.

4. CONSULTATION

- 4.1 Given the nature of the proposed measures, only junction entry treatment and the proposed double yellow lines are subject to a statutory consultation. To introduce the necessary double yellow lines at the junctions, a statutory consultation was carried out between 31st May and 22nd Jun 2018. The consultation included the erection of street Notices on lamp columns in the vicinity of the proposals and the publication of the Council's intentions in the Local Guardian and the London Gazette. Consultation documents were available at the Link, Merton Civic Centre and on the Council's website. A newsletter with a plan, attached as Appendix 3, was also circulated to all those properties included within the consultation area.
- 4.2 The consultation resulted in one representation which is attached in appendix 3.
- 4.3 All Emergency Services have been consulted and no objections have been raised.

5.0 **RECOMMENDATIONS**

- 5.1 It is recommended that the Cabinet Member considers the representation received along with officer's comments and approves the making of the Traffic Management Order and the implementation of the proposed measures. If agreed the works will be carried out during 2018 / 19 financial year.
- 5.2 It is envisaged that the proposed measures will complement the existing traffic calming features; further improve pedestrian movement, lower vehicular speeds and improve perception of safety.

6.0 ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS

6.1 Do Nothing. This, however, would be contrary to the Council's adopted practice in improving areas within the vicinity of all schools in the borough. It also would do nothing to address safety concerns that have been raised.

7.0 FINANCIAL RESOURCE AND PROPERTY IMPLICATIONS

- 7.1 The cost of implementing this scheme is estimated at £50k. This includes the cost of the statutory consultation and making of the relevant Traffic Management Orders
- 7.2 The cost of this scheme will be funded from TfL Capital LiP allocation for 2018/19.

8.0 LEGAL AND STATUTORY IMPLICATIONS

- 8.1 The Traffic Management Orders would be made under Section 6 and Section 45 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended). The Council is required by the Local Authorities Traffic Order (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1996 to give notice of its intention to make a Traffic Order (by publishing a draft traffic order). These regulations also require the Council to consider any representations received as a result of publishing the draft order
- 8.2 The Council has discretion as to whether or not to hold a public inquiry before deciding whether or not to make a Traffic Management Order or to modify the published draft Order. A public inquiry should be held where it would provide further information, which would assist the Cabinet Member in reaching a decision.
- 8.3 The Council's powers to make Traffic Management Orders arise mainly under sections 6, 45, 46, 122 and 124 and schedules 1 and 9 of the RTRA 1984.

9.0 HUMAN RIGHTS & EQUALITIES AND COMMUNITY COHENSION IMPLICATIONS

9.1 The implementation of any scheme endeavours to meet the needs of all road users particularly the more vulnerable such as those with disabilities and children.

11.0 ENVIRONMENTAL IMPICATIONS

- 11.1 When determining the type of parking places are to be designated on the highway, section 45(3) requires the Council to consider both the interests of traffic and those of the owners and occupiers of adjoining properties. In particular, the Council must have regard to: (a) the need for maintaining the free movement of traffic, (b) the need for maintaining reasonable access to premises, and (c) the extent to which off-street parking is available in the neighbourhood or if the provision of such parking is likely to be encouraged by designating paying parking places on the highway
- 11.2 By virtue of section 122, the Council must exercise its powers under the RTRA 1984 so as to secure the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of vehicular and other traffic including pedestrians, and the provision of suitable and adequate parking facilities on and off the highway. These powers must be exercised so far as practicable having regard to the following matters:-
 - (a) the desirability of securing and maintaining reasonable access to premises.
 - (b) the effect on the amenities of any locality affected including the regulation and restriction of heavy commercial traffic so as to preserve or improve amenity.
 - (c) the national air quality strategy.
 - (d) facilitating the passage of public service vehicles and securing the safety and convenience of their passengers.
 - (e) any other matters appearing to the Council to be relevant.



Dear Resident/Business,

The purpose of this newsletter is to inform you that as part of the Council's School safety programme, the Council is proposing to introduce some improvements at Church Hill / St Aubyn's Ave / Lake Road junctions. It is considered that the proposals will improve access, sightlines and manage the potential conflict between pedestrians and vehicles. The proposed measures include junction entry treatments and double yellow lines as shown on plan overleaf.

The Council will also take the opportunity to refresh road markings; install some 20mph signs and roundels and declutter Lake Rd/ Leopold Rd junction.

What happens next

A Notice of the Council's intention to introduce the above proposed measures will be published in the local newspaper and posted on lamp columns in the vicinity.

Dear Sirs

Thank you for your information about the above, as a frequent user of the junction I am pleased to see some attention is to be given to this junction. Please will this work address the following problems that I see at this junction?

1) Exiting St Aubyns Avenue the sight line up Church Hill is bad; it is difficult to see if there are any vehicles, cyclists or pedestrians coming down Church Hill.

2) Exiting St Aubyns Avenue to go up Church Hill a) the sight line to see traffic coming down Lake Road and turning into Church Hill is bad. b) Vehicles coming down Lake Road and turning into Church Hill seem able to do this at some speed. The combination of these factors make exiting St Aubyns to go up Church Hill more risky than it should be.

3) Pedestrians walking down Church Hill seem sometimes to be unaware of St Aubyns Avenue and walk across St Aubyns Avenue without looking or stopping for vehicles turning into St Aubyns Avenue, particularly looking for vehicles coming down Church Hill.

4) Turning into St Aubyns Avenue coming down Church Hill or from either direction on Lake Road has to be carried out at a much slower speed than vehicles not turning into St Aubyns Avenue and the difference in speed catches other drivers by surprise.

5) Turning into St Aubyns Avenue coming down Church Hill or from either direction from Lake Road sometimes one has to stop to allow traffic to pass coming down Church Hill or for pedestrians to cross in either direction catching other drivers by surprise.

As a general comment the junction seemed to be safer before some alterations were carried out some years ago those alterations would seem better being reversed. Also I am glad to see the more prominent notices of the 20 mph limit.

Officer's Comment

Given the geometry of the junction, the Council is aware of perception of safety and sightline difficulties. Although the geometry of the junction cannot be changed, it is considered that the proposed measures will complement the existing traffic calming features; further improve pedestrian movement, improve sightlines, lower vehicular speeds, raise road user awareness and improve the overall access and perception of safety.
