

### 6. Decision

- I, Councillor Andrew Judge, the Cabinet Member for Environmental Sustainability and Regeneration;
- A) Note the results of the informal consultation carried out between 7<sup>th</sup> October to 28<sup>th</sup> October 2014 on the proposals to introduce the following waiting and loading measures on Upper Green East and West in Mitcham:

- Introduction of a 24 hour 'Restricted Parking Zone'. This means that
  parking on the perimeter street would only be allowed in specified
  parking bays. Parking outside the parking bays (e.g. on the road) would
  not be allowed.
- Parking bays: 30 minutes maximum stay, no return within 2 hours
- Parking bays to operate Monday Saturday 08:30 18:30 and Sunday 10:00am – 16:00pm. Outside of these times there would be no restrictions on parking in the parking bays.
- Four loading bays for market traders only. These would only be available for market traders with permits every day between 06:00 and 09:00 and between 15:00 and 18:00.
- · A disabled bay, available at all times
- Four bays with a no waiting yellow line. Loading and unloading would be permitted on the yellow lined bays for up to 40 mins between: Monday – Saturday: 8:30 – 10:00 and 16:00 – 18:30
- The same four bays would operate with a maximum of 30 minutes free parking between Monday – Sunday: 10:00 – 16:00
- B) Agree to proceed with a statutory consultation on the proposed parking measures

Proposals accord with the objectives of the Rediscover Mitcham Project. Majority support for the proposals, with no substantive objections. Alternative options considered and rejected.

### Recommendations:

That the Cabinet Member for Environmental Sustainability and Regeneration considers the issues detailed in this report and:

- A) Notes the result of the informal consultation carried out between 7 October and 28 October 2014 on the proposals for new parking arrangements on the Mitcham Fair Green (Upper Green East and Upper Green West). These proposals form part of the Rediscover Mitcham project.
- B) Agrees to proceed with statutory consultation for all the measures proposed in the informal consultation.

### 1 PURPOSE OF REPORT AND EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- 1.1 An informal consultation was carried out to find residents and businesses views on new parking arrangements for the Fair Green. This report seeks approval to take the parking proposals through to statutory consultation.
- 1.2 The consultation was carried out as part of the Rediscover Mitcham Town Centre regeneration project. Previous consultations on the broader aims of the project indicated support for the concept of short term high turnover parking on the Fair Green. The proposals also included provision for market traders to load, a disabled bay, loading bays for shops and options for hours Sunday hours of operation.

1.3 18 responses were received from 213 sent to addresses within a vicinity around the Fair Green (see appendix for area covered) and to market traders who did not live in the area. The results showed a majority in favour of the proposals. Comments received principally related to general complaints about the Rediscover Mitcham project.

### 2 DETAILS

- 2.1 The key objectives of the parking proposals are:
  - To facilitate short term, high turn over parking to stimulate local business activity.
  - To provide a dedicated disabled parking bay
  - To provide loading facilities for shops on the Fair Green
  - To provide dedicated loading facilities for Market traders at specific times, which will operate as pedestrian footway space outside of these times.
- 2.2 Measures proposed in the consultation were:
  - Introduction of a 24 hour 'Restricted Parking Zone'. This means that parking on the perimeter street would only be allowed in specified parking bays.
     Parking outside the parking bays (e.g. on the road) would not be allowed.
  - Parking bays: 30 minutes max stay, no return within 2 hours
  - Monday Sunday 08:30 18:30. Outside of these times there would be no restrictions on parking in the parking bays.
  - Four large loading bays for market traders only. These would only be available for market traders with permits every day between 06:00 and 09:00 and between 15:00 and 18:00.
  - A disabled bay at all times
  - Four bays with a no waiting yellow line. Loading and unloading would be permitted on the yellow lined bays for up to 40 mins between: Monday – Saturday: 8:30 – 10:00 and 16:00 – 18:30
  - The same four bays would operate with 30mins free parking between:
     Monday Sunday: 10:00 16:00

### 3 INFORMAL CONSULTATION RESULTS

- 3.1 As part of the public consultation for the Rediscover Mitcham project a question was asked to gauge support for the introduction of new short term parking within the vicinity of Fair Green. This question received support from 78% of respondents, so in order to take forward the proposal an informal consultation was carried out to better understand the issues associated with such proposals.
- 3.2 The informal consultation took place for three weeks between 7<sup>th</sup> October to 28<sup>th</sup> October 2014 with 213 consultation leaflets and questionnaires sent out by 1<sup>st</sup> class Royal Mail to addresses within the area around the Fair Green. 5 were returned unopened with Royal Mail indicating addressees were away or they were unable to access the property.
- 3.3 A total of 18 responses were received indicating a response rate of 8.6%
- 3.4 The consultation leaflet detailed the proposed measures in written and plan form. Consultees were given the options of returning the questionnaire by post or completing an on-line version.

- 3.6 Some respondents did not provide answers to all the questions. Notably the Sunday hours of operation which consultees appeared not to answer as a form of protest as they did not agree with the scheme as a whole or any Sunday hours of operation.
- 3.7 When respondents gave a 'no' answer they either did not detail why or stated that it was generally because they did not support the proposals for the Fair Green as a whole. An example is as follows:
  - "I disagree that you are taking away a car park and replacing it with these parking proposals. In 10-15 years time you be looking for changes again there is no foresight to the area"
- 3.8 No responses were received from any of the market traders despite consultation packs being sent to their addresses if they were outside the consultation area. This may indicate the relatively low support for the market trader only bays.
- 3.9 A concern was raised about the mini-cab office on Upper Green West taking advantage of the parking bays and using them to wait for passengers. Currently the cab office picks up from behind the building on Sibthorpe Road. It is possible that with the introduction of the perimeter street could lead to parking related issues with cabs occupying the bays and potentially blocking the road. Enforcement of the bays will be needed to prevent this from becoming a problem. However, it is not certain to be a major issue, as there is no evidence of a high demand for cabs from this location at the current time.
- 3.10 Another potential issue is that of a shop, G & M House Clearance, the owner of which currently unloads and packs up stock to an agreed trading space outside the shop on Upper Green West. The design of the footway and parking bays has been altered to accommodate the trading space outside the shop. The owner parks and loads from a large van outside the shop in the morning and afternoon and intends to do so in the new scheme. Whilst this would technically be allowed, there is the potential for the 30 minute parking restriction to be exploited or for the delivery vehicle to overhang on to the footway or partially obstruct the road. G & M House Clearance sits next to a proposed informal pedestrian crossing and there is also a concern that this could be blocked when loading creating a safety issue.
- 3.11 Regular contact has been made with the owner of G & M House Clearance who has complained about the proposed scheme affecting business particularly whilst the works take place. It is proposed that bollards are installed at the informal pedestrian crossing to prevent vehicles from parking on the footway and blocking the crossing or the carriageway.

- 3.12 Two comments were received about concerns that the proposals could mean increased parking in Montrose Gardens. As the proposals provide more parking than is currently available around the Fair Green it is unlikely that the situation will be made worse.
- 3.13 Sunday hours of operation were proposed to be 8.30am 6.30pm to reduce potential confusion by having consistent hours through the week (the same as Monday to Saturday). However as Sundays historically have different trading hours consultees were given the option to choose 10.00am to 4pm as an alternative. The 10am to 4pm option received a majority of 60%. Therefore, it is proposed that the statutory consultation will have Sunday hours of operation of between 10am to 4pm.

### 4 PROPOSED MEASURES

- 4.1 The following measures are proposed as part of the statutory consultation:
  - Introduction of a 24 hour 'Restricted Parking Zone'. This means that parking on the perimeter street would only be allowed in specified parking bays.
     Parking outside the parking bays (e.g. on the road) would not be allowed.
  - Parking bays: 30 minutes max stay, no return within 2 hours
  - Monday Saturday 08:30 18:30 and Sunday 10:00am 4:00pm. Out of these times there would be no restrictions on parking in the parking bays.
  - Four large loading bays for market traders only. These would only be available for market traders with permits every day between 06:00 and 09:00 and between 15:00 and 18:00.
  - A disabled bay at all times
  - Four bays with a no waiting yellow line. Loading and unloading would be permitted on the yellow lined bays for up to 40 mins between: Monday – Saturday: 8:30 – 10:00 and 16:00 – 18:30
  - The same four bays would operate with 30mins free parking between:
     Monday Sunday: 10:00 16:00

### 6 ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS

- 6.1 Do nothing. This would not address the objectives of the Rediscover Mitcham project or the new design for the Fair Green.
- 6.2 No Sunday hours of operation. Parking issues are just as likely to occur on Sunday.
- 6.3 Restrict access to the space for parking and loading. This would prevent the aim of providing short term and high turnover parking from being achieved. As there was significant public support for this proposal in the 2013 Rediscover Mitcham consultation it would not be advisable to provide something different.

### 7 FINANCIAL RESOURCE AND PROPERTY IMPLICATIONS

7.1 Costs for signing / lining and the introduction of two pay & display machines will be met from the Rediscover Mitcham project budget.

### 8 LEGAL AND STATUTORY IMPLICATIONS

- 8.1 The Traffic Management Orders would be made under Section 6 and Section 45 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended). The Council is required by the Local Authorities Traffic Order (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1996 to give notice of its intention to make a Traffic Order (by publishing a draft traffic order). These regulations also require the Council to consider any representations received as a result of publishing the draft order.
- 8.2 The Council has discretion as to whether or not to hold a public inquiry before deciding whether or not to make a Traffic Management Order or to modify the published draft Order. A public inquiry should be held where it would provide further information, which would assist the Cabinet Member in reaching a decision.

# 9 HUMAN RIGHTS, EQUALITIES AND COMMUNITY COHESION IMPLICATIONS

9.1 The implementation of new parking arrangements and restricted zone affects all sections of the community and assists in improving safety for all road users and achieves the Merton regeneration aims for Mitcham and transport planning policies of the government, the Mayor for London and the Borough.

Dear Resident/Business,

The introduction of new parking arrangements on and around the Fair Green are proposed as part of the Rediscover Mitcham project. This leaflet describes the proposed parking changes and gives you the opportunity to have your say on them.

### **Background**

Rediscover Mitcham is a partnership project to restore the heart of Mitcham (the partners are Merton Council, Transport for London, The Greater London Authority and Heritage Lottery Fund). It aims to improve accessibility to the Fair Green and surrounding streets by making pedestrian movement around the area easier, therefore contributing to a revival of the shops and market. The Fair Green and its immediate surroundings are the centre of Mitcham and the key to its rejuvenation.

We also want to make the Fair Green an attractive, pleasant, safe and convenient place to be. Changes to parking are key elements to the plans to improve the Fair Green.

### Fair Green - proposed changes to parking

A major part of the improvements is to reinstate the old roads of Upper Green East and Upper Green West. For simplicity in this document we are calling these roads the 'perimeter street' around the Fair Green. This road will allow cars and bicycles to access the shops around the Green. The specific parking proposals for the Fair Green are:

- 1. Introduction of a 24 hour 'Restricted Parking Zone'. This means that parking on the perimeter street would only be allowed in specified parking bays. Parking outside the parking bays (e.g. on the road) would not be allowed.
- Parking bays with 30 mins free parking. To encourage short term parking and a
  higher turnover of cars, 30 minutes free parking on the perimeter street would be
  proposed. For parking for longer periods of time there is parking available in the
  surrounding car parks at Sibthorpe Road, Raleigh Gardens and the Morrisons
  multi-storey.

Parking bays: 30 minutes max stay, no return within 2 hours

• Monday - Sunday 08:30 - 18:30

Outside of these times there would be no restrictions on parking in the parking bays. Parking anywhere but the parking bays would not be allowed at any time.

3. Four large loading bays for market traders only. These would only be available for market traders with permits every day between 06:00 and 09:00 and between 15:00 and 18:00. At all other times no parking or loading would be allowed in these bays so people walking can freely pass through the space.

Market trader permit holder only:

- Every day 06:00 09:00 and 15:00 18:00
- 4. A disabled bay: at all times
- 5. Four bays with a no waiting yellow line. Loading and unloading would be permitted on the yellow lined bays for up to 40 mins between:
  - Monday Saturday: 8:30 10:00 and 16:00 18:30

The same bays would operate with 30mins free parking between:

• Monday – Sunday: 10:00 – 16:00


### What happens now?

Construction work is due to start on the Fair Green in January 2015 and completed in summer 2015.


