Re:- Application for a Premises Licence - FND Limited, Unit 23, 55-59 Weir Road, Wimbledon. SW19 8UG

On 6th May 2015 an application was received from FND Limited for a premises licence under the Licensing Act 2003 at the above address.

The application can be summarised as follows:-

Supply of Alcohol Monday to Thursday	1200-0100
Friday/Saturday	1200-0300
Sunday	1200-2300

Police wish to make representations to the application on three of the four licensing objectives :-

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
Public Nuisance
Protection of Children from Harm

This premises is a food delivery outlet which operates from an industrial estate. It is understood that the premises deliver food until 0200. There is and will be no public access.

It is recognised that no members of the public will be able to purchase alcohol from the premises directly and any orders will be delivered to the purchasers address. There is a concern that alcohol will be delivered into the wrong hands unless appropriate safeguards are in place. The applicant proposes to supply alcohol late into the night at a time where it is likely that customers may already have been drinking, the likelihood of crime and disorder is therefore increased. It is with this in mind that the following conditions are considered.

1. Alcohol will only be supplied if it is ancillary to food
2. All sales of alcohol for delivery must be paid for at the time of ordering.

3. A record of orders will be kept which will include the customer's full details and that the Challenge 25 policy was explained to them. This log will be made available to police and Council officers on request.
4. The delivery of alcohol will only be made to a residential or business address. The delivery of alcohol will not be made to a person in a public place.
5. The person taking the order and/or making the delivery must ensure that the recipient is 18 years of age. A check will be made to ensure the person accepting the delivery has the debit/credit card used for the purchase or order reference generated by other means of payment and if they appear under 25 years of age, photographic ID will be required before the alcohol is handed over.
6. All staff will receive documented training in relation to the relevant sections of the Licensing Act 2003. This shall be repeated every 6 months. Records of training will be kept and made available to Police or Council Officers on request.
